### Program: Professor Edward Kocher and future Duquesne University Superstars!!

Dr. Edward Kocher will lead an informative presentation that encapsulates ways that music schools and symphony orchestras work together to develop and nurture the talent that sustains the orchestra into the future. He and Duquesne graduate students will provide live music to enhance the discussion. He brings exceptional experience, energy, and enthusiasm to the classroom, stage, and the national arts community. Currently, serving as Duquesne Professor of Music, he shares his love and passion for symphonic music and our beloved Pittsburgh Symphony with students

from the broad university population. From 2014–2019, he served as the inaugural holder of the William Patrick Power, C.S.Sp. Endowed Faculty Chair in Academic Leadership at Duquesne University. From 2000–2014, he served as Dean and Professor at Duquesne's Mary Pappert School of Music. An accomplished trombonist, Dr. Kocher's performance credits include tours and recordings with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, on stage performances at the Lyric Opera of Chicago, a 2007 GRAMMY winning recording with Nancy Wilson on the MCG Jazz label, and a host of solo and chamber music performances in America, Europe, and Asia.

An energetic and passionate advocate for the arts, he has served in an impressive array of leadership roles including the Commission for Accreditation for the National Association of Schools of Music, President of the Board of Directors of the Pittsburgh Chamber Music Society, and as a member of the Arts Education Collaborative Steering Committee. He serves on the Board of Directors for the Belle Voci intergenerational women's chorus, and the Pittsburgh Jazz Orchestra.

His current scholarly agenda focuses on using technology to develop improvisation and performances of music for trombone and organ.

Prior to his appointment at Duquesne University, he served for two decades at DePaul University in Chicago, IL, where he earned competitive grants for technology, improvisation, and diversity initiatives. Professor Kocher earned a Doctor of Philosophy in Public Policy Analysis-Education at the University of Illinois at Chicago, a Master of Arts in Trombone Performance at the University of Iowa, and a Bachelor of Music Education at Northwestern University.

# Dr. Kocher will be accompanied by graduate students at Duquesne University's Mary Pappert School of Music:

Anderson Lacerda (born in Brazil) and Maryia Krastanova (born in Bulgaria) both studied for the artist degree at Duquesne University in the class of Charles Stegeman in 2022/2023. Both began their studies in childhood.

Mr. Lacerda will play Bartok's concerto for violin and orchestra and an excerpt from Don Juan (Strauss).

Ms Krastanova will play the Brahms concerto for violin and orchestra and an excerpt from Brahms Symphony 4 (4th movement).

*Note:* Symphony East is hoping that this October 21, 2024, program will be of interest to students, parents, teachers, and counselors interested in the Mary Pappert School of Music, and invites you to join us that day. Admission to the program from 1:00-2:00 PM is free for students and teachers. Anyone wishing to come for lunch should complete and send the reservation form.

At SE's September meeting, the Symphony East audience enjoyed performances by two excellent trombonists who substituted for James Nova and Robert Matchett III. They were Mark L. Lusk, Professor Emeritus at Penn State, and Taylor Jones, second trombone in the Pittsburgh Opera Orchestra since 2018. Here are excerpts from their biographies:



Prior to his appointment in 1986 at PSU, Professor Lusk enjoyed a varied career with such diverse groups as the Woody Herman Thundering Herd, the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, the Eastman Wind Ensemble, and the Chicago Contemporary Chamber Players. He continues to have an active playing career as a soloist, clinician, and freelance musician and he has performed throughout the U.S. and abroad, including featured performances at jazz festivals worldwide. He has also performed on Broadway, including the recent production of Little Women. Mr. Lusk is a native of Brandenburg, Kentucky and the proud father of seven. He holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Eastman School of Music and a performance certificate from Northwestern University. He was Kevin McManus' professor at Penn State.



Mr. Jones is an active freelancer who also regularly performs with the Pittsburgh Symphony, Wheeling Symphony (WV), Westmoreland Symphony, and Johnstown Symphony Orchestras, and the River City Brass Band. Before moving to Pittsburgh in 2018 from hometown Birmingham, Alabama, he held the position of Bass Trombone in the Meridian Symphony Orchestra, Mississippi, for two seasons. He greatly enjoys performing in chamber music settings such as Chamber Orchestra Pittsburgh, where he recorded Stravinsky's *L'Histoire du soldat, Pulcinella Suite*, and Messiaen's monumental *Des canyons aux etoiles*.... He has performed with Andrea Bocelli, Yo-Yo Ma, The Who, Weird Al Yankovic, Mac McAnally, and the Coral Reefer Band. Mr. Jones holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Performance from The University of Southern Mississippi, where he gained experience in both classical and commercial idioms, and a Master of Music degree from Duquesne University where he studied with James Nova.
